Principal's Message

Del Sur is proud of our distinctive programs provided for students in TK through 8th grade. Our college prep initiative known as AVID, Advancement Via Individual Determination is one of the most prominent programs that supports our career and college goals on campus. The college and career readiness goals we have focused on this year are specifically in the areas of writing and creating SMART goals that are self-monitored for progress, which aids in gaining confidence and independence. We are committed to maintaining a safe campus where students are supported academically, socially, and emotionally. We continue to integrate and develop Project Lead the Way Curriculum and STEM based projects throughout the school year. We also offer interventions such as FastForWord and tutoring opportunities during the school day. We believe every child entrusted to our care must be provided with quality instruction. This year's SPARC is directly tied to our LCAP and Single Plan for Student Achievement goals of providing increasing student achievement and maintaining a safe campus climate. Del Sur School earned WASC (Western Association of School and Colleges) accreditation in 2019, making it one of the few K-8 schools in California with this credential.

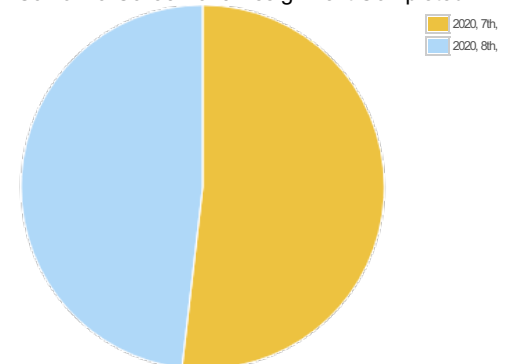
Career and College Readiness Student Outcomes

The Student Support Team (SST) is guided by the ASCA Mindsets and Behaviors for student success and K-12 college-and-career-readiness standards. We use student outcomes to measure the effectiveness of programs for continuous improvement. The following graphs illustrate the number of students who completed a California Career Zone career planning assignment and the number of students who are achieving academically at grade level.

Career Readiness

Teachers at Del Sur, along with the SST members, provide projects on career research including career requirements and education. The goal is for the student to leave Del Sur with the knowledge and skill set to identify occupations that correlate with their interest, values, and strengths. This year, Del Sur middle school has implemented a career readiness project called, "Lets Party" through the California Career Zone. Portfolios and projects were made to begin their career exploration. This also allowed the student to explore careers in detail, including educational requirements, potential salary earnings, and cost of living simulation. The graph to the right shows 100% of 7th graders, and 92.96% 8th graders completed the career readiness project. Our goal is to have 100% of 8th graders to complete.

College Readiness

The Del Sur SST members take pride in the efforts of our students' achievements and acknowledges their significant importance to college readiness. All 7th and 8th grade students may earn Honor Roll Awards. Honor Roll is given to all students reaching a 3.0 and above. A study skills elective class is now offered for students in need of extra support to achieve that academic goal. The graph on the right illustrates honor roll awards received for the first semester of this school year: Fifty-five 7th grade students, and fifty-eight 8th grade students received honor roll awards.

21st Century Skills

The Del Sur SST coordinates and monitors several programs that foster 21st Century Skills within our students. To encourage students' abilities to prosper in a world of change, collaboration, communication and critical thinking are promoted. Programs highlighting self-regulation, emotional intelligence, and responsible social interaction are coached through programs on campus such as: Boy's Town, Leadership Development Through Physical Education (LDTPE), Organization Nation, Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID), Robotics, Campus Climate Assistants (CCA) and lunch time interventions. Teachers meet monthly with Data Teams to analyze the achievement of their practice and outcomes of their students. The all-encompassing ability to be proficient in the skill of learning, literacy and life skills is the goal.

Additional Achievements:

- NWEA Assessments given three times a year
- School wide classroom technology available, Chromebook check out for home use as necessary
- 11 point increase for English Learners in Math SBAC standardized test from 2018 to 2019 scores

Career and College Readiness School Site Programs and Community Partnerships

The SST, along with every staff member at Del Sur School, including our aides and teachers, contribute to our site and community programs. These programs promote the development of career and college readiness skills through technology, teamwork, and interventions. Site programs and community partnerships provide opportunities for all students to become career and college ready. The Del Sur School campus is known for our hydroponic garden that students maintain with assigned duties, while learning about preservation and recycling. Community support is gratefully received by our student population.
